The County of San Diego's Land Use and Environment Group serves the community by working to protect the public's health and safety, sustain the environment, and improve the quality of life for our residents and visitors.



- \$6.3M Initiatives to reduce greenhouse gases
- \$2.8M Guide the region toward zero carbon emissions (RDF)
- \$2.5M Climate Action Plan Update
- \$6.7M Divert waste from landfills

- \$30.1M Million to facilitate housing by creating affordable housing programs and removing barriers to housing through things like guaranteed plan review times for 100% affordable housing projects

- \$33.2M Operate 33 branch libraries, 4 mobile libraries and 5 automated book kiosks
- \$65.5M Maintain unincorporated county road surfaces
- \$52.8M Maintain/operate County sewer system and water districts
- \$27.7M Operate our eight County airports



- \$189M Support roads safety by maintaining traffic signals, curb ramps, pedestrian crossings, guardrails, and providing new sidewalks and bike lanes
- \$4.7M Keep culverts, channels, levees, storm drains safe and clean (supports \$72.1M for watershed protection)
- \$10.7M Maintain safe, beautiful park and library facilities
- \$1.7M Construct runway improvements at County airports
- \$330K Pest control services at County occupied facilities
